

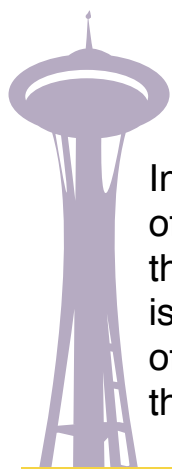

at Seattle Center

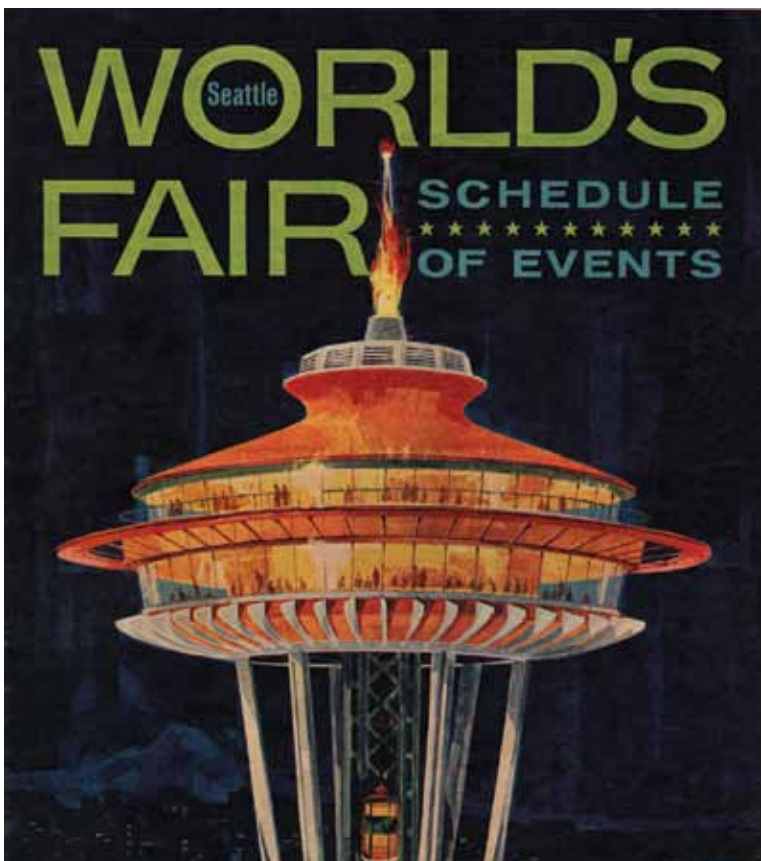
*Celebrating Century 21* is a series of three complementary exhibits that explore Seattle's 1962 World's Fair and its impact on the Seattle of today.

***Centuries of Progress: American World's Fairs, 1853 -1982*** is a national travelling exhibit from the Hagley Museum and Library in Wilmington, Delaware, an organization that collects, preserves and interprets the history of American enterprise.

***The Future Remembered*** showcases a wide range of artifacts, photographs and media documents from the 1962 World's Fair

selected from MOHAI's collection. The exhibit, produced by MOHAI, is curated by Paula Becker and Alan Stein of HistoryLink with support from the Seattle Center Foundation.

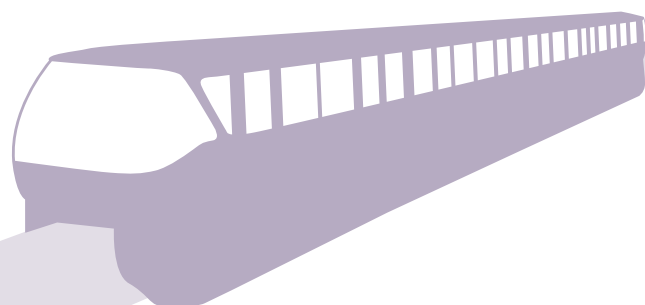
